Recycling Creates Jobs for Disabled

Primus Industries, a unit of the Albany Area Community Service Board, a program that serves mentally challenged adults was established in 1972.

Our main objective is to train the individuals that we serve to be productive citizens. The on-site facility staff provides hands on hand training to complete tasks. This program presently serves 118 facility-based adults, 25 of these adults work in the recycling department. Additionally, there are approximately 45 adults that work in the community with support.

One of our main sources of revenue is derived from our recycling division. For the fiscal year 1999/2000, we have generated over 1-1/4 million pounds of recyclable products. Our supervised consumers go into the community, collect cardboard, newspapers, computer paper, and aluminum cans to recycle. These items are brought to the facility to be baled and shipped out to our buyers. This process has saved landfill space by diverting tons of newsprint, aluminum and paper that would normally be sent there.


