## **The City of Williamson Recycling Program**

The City of Williamson has a recycling program with Dependable Waste Services, Inc. Citizen's waste collection charge, which is included with the municipal water bill, entitles them to participate in a program which allows them to place all of their recyclables at their curbside for pick-up. No sorting is necessary! About sixty per cent of solid waste is recyclable. That means over half of our trash can be recycled and doesn't need to go into a landfill. This small effort keeps our waste collection costs down since the charge for putting waste into landfills is rising. Reducing the amount of trash we put into the ground greatly helps our environment and reduces the amount of raw resources we consume to manufacture many products.

Most household waste items are acceptable for recycling, such as glass, plastic, paper and cardboard, aluminum and other metal cans. We only need to rinse food residue from bottles, jars, cans and our recycler cannot accept paper plates, pizza boxes, etc. which have been contaminated with food and grease residue. See the Dependable Waste Services, Inc. flyer for more details.

### **WEEKLY PICK-UP NOW!**

Recyclables may be placed in a standard 18-gallon recycling bin which is provided through an agreement between the City of Williamson and Dependable Waste. Residents may use their own container or a plastic trash bag for excess recyclables if necessary. We place the recyclables at curbside so they can be picked up every Wednesday. Pick-up time will be between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Recyclables should be placed at the curb on Wednesday morning to avoid overnight disturbance by weather or animals. Thanks for your cooperation in order to keep our landfill use and associated costs down.

## **Chapter 4-3 SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL**

State Law Reference: Authority of municipalities to provide for garbage and solid waste collection and disposal, O.C.G.A. § 12-8-30.9, Powers of local governmental bodies; O.C.G.A. § 12-8-31.1. Local, multijurisdictional, or regional solid waste plans.

Sections:

- 4-3-1 Preparation and storage of waste.
- 4-3-2 Unauthorized accumulation of solid waste; nuisance.
- 4-3-3 Scavenging.
- 4-3-4 Penalties.
- 4-3-5 Recycling.

**Sec. 4-3-1 PREPARATION AND STORAGE OF WASTE.** The owner or occupant of each residence or business or commercial establishment shall be charged for waste collection on a monthly basis. The City will include waste collection charges with the municipal water bill. The City may contract with a waste collection service for solid waste collection and disposal. A standard, roll-out container shall be provided by the waste collection company. Additional garbage and/or trash containers provided by the owner or occupant shall at all times be maintained in a good state of repair and have a cover to keep the rain out. Each owner or occupant shall arrange for curbside positioning of waste generated at his residence, business or commercial establishment in accordance with the published schedule of collection. Waste containers should be placed at curbside no earlier than 4:00 pm on the day prior to the published day of collection and the containers removed from curbsides and relocated upon private property no later than 12:00 noon on the day after the day of waste collection. For example, if waste collection is scheduled for Thursdays, waste containers should be placed at curbside after 4:00 pm on Wednesday afternoon and brought back from the curb before 12:00 noon on Friday. This gives residents time to place containers out before dark on the day before pick-up and bring back the containers in the daylight on the day after pick-up while minimizing time for wind or animals to displace or disturb the container and its contents.

**Sec. 4-3-2 UNAUTHORIZED ACCUMULATION OF SOLID WASTE; NUISANCE.** Any unauthorized accumulation of solid waste on any premises is hereby declared to be a nuisance and is prohibited. Failure to remove any existing accumulation of solid waste within a reasonable time as may be fixed by written notice from the City shall be deemed a violation of this code.

**Sec. 4-3-3 SCAVENGING.** No person other than the owner or occupant of each residence or business or commercial establishment shall interfere with any container placed for the purpose of storing solid waste pending collection, or remove or take any of the contents therein, or remove any container from the location where the container has been placed by the owner or occupant of that residence or business or commercial establishment.

**Sec. 4-3-4 PENALTIES.** Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be punished as provided in section 1-1-5 of this code.

**Sec. 4-3-5 RECYCLING.** The City of Williamson may offer or provide for collection and transfer of recyclable materials in order to aid in preserving our environment and reducing costs associated with the collection, transport and disposal of garbage in landfills. The City may adopt policy and create and enforce ordinances pertaining to the collection and transfer of recyclable materials.



**REVISED REQUIREMENTS, SUBMISSION, and APPROVAL PROCEDURES**  
**Solid Waste Management Plan Five-Year Short-Term Work Program (STWP)**

1. The public hearing process (one public hearing) for Solid Waste Management Plan STWP is no longer a requirement.
2. Local Government Certification Form:
  - a. This certification form replaces the need for *both* transmittal and adoption resolutions.
3. Local governments shall prepare and submit an update to their Implementation Strategy every five years. This update shall include:
  - a. a report of plan accomplishments that must identify the current status of each activity in the existing Short-Term Work Program and
  - b. a new Short-Term Work Program covering the next five-year planning period.
    - i. For the report of accomplishments the local governments shall, at a minimum, indicate activities that:
      1. have been completed;
      2. are currently underway, including an anticipated project completion date if applicable
      3. have been postponed, with justification; and
      4. have not been accomplished and are no longer being considered for implementation, again with justification and documentation that the basic tenets of the plan are still intact.
4. Each STWP must include population projections and disposal tonnage projections for the last five years of the planning period plus an additional five years for a total of 10 year projections.
5. Each STWP update must include an assurance that the local government(s) have ten years of disposal capacity (last five years of the planning period plus an additional five years) from the landfill(s) accepting waste from that planning jurisdiction.
6. All local governments in the planning jurisdiction must complete the Annual Solid Waste Management survey online through the ReTrac reporting system for five (5) consecutive years from baseline year 2008.
  - a. Prior to submitting the Solid Waste Management Plan Short Term Work Program, the Regional Commission will confirm with DCA that the local government(s) have completed the Annual Solid Waste Survey reporting requirement. The local government(s) will be responsible for completing the appropriate year(s) of the Annual Solid Waste Survey before the RC is able to submit the STWP.
7. The Regional Commission will submit the following documents electronically to the designated SharePoint folder:
  - a. Local Government Certification Form
  - b. 10 year population and disposal projections
  - c. Updated 5 year Short Term Work Program and Implementation Strategy
  - d. Capacity Assurance
8. When all of the required documents are posted to SharePoint, DCA will review the documents according to the timeframe outlined in the Solid Waste Minimum Planning Standards.
