## Wilcox County Solid Waste Management Plan

### **I. Introduction**

Wilcox County is located in the south central region of the State of Georgia. Created by a State Legislative act in 1857, Wilcox County is a community with a significant elderly population that is experiencing minimal growth. Located approximately 10 miles east of Interstate 75 along U.S. Highway 280, Wilcox County has good transportation routes connecting the county to several of Georgia's major cities. These transportation routes serve as major thoroughfares through Wilcox County. Many motorists traveling east to west from Cordele to Savannah utilize State Route 30 /U.S. 280 as an efficient means of transportation. State Route 11/U.S. 129 also serves as a quick and efficient route to reach Macon and other cities further north and south in Georgia. With an estimated 2003 population of 8,764, the county's population increased 14.1 percent from 1980 to 2003. In 2000, the number of occupied housing units was 2,785. A vast majority of Wilcox County's land area consists of agriculture and forestland (approximately 80 percent). The largest employer in Wilcox County is the Wilcox State Prison, which employs 312 people. The largest commercial employer is Doster Warehouse, Inc., which employs 65 people. There are no other commercial industries located in Wilcox County that employ 50 or more people. This makes the warehouse a critical employer for an economy in Wilcox County that is still fairly dependent upon agriculture and forestry uses.

Wilcox County has four incorporated cities that are participating in this solid waste plan. The City of Abbeville is the county seat of Wilcox County. Its estimated 2003 population was 2,407. The City of Pineview had an estimated 2003 population of 536. The City of Pitts had an estimated 2003 population of 310. The City of Rochelle had an estimated 2003 population of 1,430.

through the years of 2003 to 2015. First, the total population for the county was projected from 2004 through 2015. Once the population was projected, the amount of waste that was disposed of by Wilcox County and its municipalities from 2000-2003 was recorded for each year. The amount of municipal solid waste that was generated each year (2000-2003) was then divided by population estimates from 2000-2003 to get a per capita amount of municipal solid waste. It was then decided to utilize the highest per capita number (0.481 in 2002) to avoid being overly conservative. Then, the 2002 per capita number was utilized to get a constant rate of the amount of solid waste disposed for the remaining years of the per capita municipal solid waste generated. Thus, it was assumed that the annual rate of growth would remain consistent in order to best produce a reasonable estimate.

To determine the total tonnage disposed, the projected population for each year (2003-2015) was then multiplied by the highest per capita number (0.481 in 2002) to determine an amount disposed for each year. This number resulted in the total projected number of tons of municipal solid waste disposed of in Wilcox County for 2003-2015.

According to the figures obtained from Wilcox County, a total of 356 tons of recyclables are collected per year on average. Figures for the tonnage of tires and cardboard recycled were based on an approximate yearly average. Figures for the amount of white goods recycled were based on an average between the years of 2002-2004. The figures were somewhat different for each year, so an average was taken to prevent skewed results because the 2002 figure was significantly higher than those for 2003 and 2004. The total number of recycled tons collected based upon 2003 figures and the average between 2002-2004 for white goods were then divided by the total number of tons disposed for 2003, because there was only one year (2003) available upon which to base the projections. This number (0.863) was then multiplied by the amount of tons disposed for each year and that resulted in the amount of tons recycled for each year.

The total tonnage of disposed waste for each year was then added to the total tonnage of recyclables to get a total amount of waste generated per year. That total was then divided by 365 to get the total tons per day. Next, the total tons

that the County can collect the trimmings and use its chipper to produce mulch. If the yard trimmings are collected in the unincorporated areas of the county, it is then placed in a 1,000 square foot area at the old Wilcox County Landfill for citizens to get as needed. The chipper itself is portable and the municipalities are allowed to use it as well. The cities of Abbeville, Pineview, Pitts, and Rochelle may also utilize the holding area at the old Wilcox County Landfill where citizens may obtain mulch. The City of Abbeville does have a composting/mulching program. The City collects trimmings two times a month by utilizing curbside pickup without charging a fee. The City borrows the county's chipper to produce the mulch. It is then taken to a 1,000 square foot area where citizens can pick it up for usage. The City of Pineview does not have a composting/mulching program, nor does it have an everyday curbside pickup that collects yard trimmings. The City does recommend taking the items to the compost/mulch site voluntarily at the old landfill. The City of Pineview uses mulch from the holding area to place in its playground area. The City of Pitts does not have a composting/mulching program, nor does it have an everyday curbside pickup that collects yard trimmings. The City does recommend taking the items to the compost/mulch site voluntarily at the old landfill. The City of Rochelle does have a composting/mulching program. The City collects trimmings everyday by utilizing curbside pickup without charging a fee. The City borrows the county's chipper to produce the mulch. It is then taken to a 1,000 square area where citizens can pick it up for usage.

#### **B. Special Management Items**

Wilcox County and its municipalities have a trailer to collect tires and an area designated for white goods located at the closed Wilcox County Landfill that citizens may utilize voluntarily to drop off the items. White goods are picked up by a private recycler, Cumbaa Enterprises located in Blountstown, Florida. The cities of Abbeville and Rochelle contract with Transwaste of the Crisp County Solid Waste Management Authority in Cordele for curbside pickup of white goods and batteries. The County, Pineview, and Pitts do not have a collection program for batteries. The cities of Pineview and Pitts utilize the County's collection program for white goods.

## V. Collection Element

### A. Inventory of Current Solid Waste and Recyclable Collection Programs

At the present time Wilcox County operates a collection system for rural residents of the county. The County utilizes dumpsters located throughout the county to collect household garbage. There are approximately 10 sites located throughout the county with a total of approximately 85 unstaffed green boxes. The County does not charge a fee to residents for solid waste collection. The County picks up the dumpsters once per week. The County also provides a commercial dumpster that is picked up twice a week for a fee of \$75.00 per month. The county has seven commercial customers. The County also provides a household-rented dumpster that is picked up twice per month for a fee of \$20.00 per month. The county has 20 household rented commercial customers. Once the garbage is collected, it is taken to the old Wilcox County Landfill, where a transfer station is located. Once it reaches the transfer station, Southern Refuse takes it to the Allied Services, LLC Landfill in Taylor County. The Allied Services, LLC Landfill has a capacity to operate for approximately 23 more years. Its remaining capacity is 38,524,149.00 cubic yards. The City of Abbeville contracts with Transwaste to collect their household waste at a rate of \$12.42 per can. Transwaste utilizes curbside pickup once a week. Once the garbage is collected, Transwaste takes it directly to the Allied Services, LLC Landfill in Taylor County. The City of Pineview uses curbside pickup in order to collect solid waste. The City is responsible for the pickup one time per week for a fee of \$12.00 per month. Once the garbage is collected, it is taken to the old Wilcox County Landfill, where a transfer station is located. Once it reaches the transfer station, Southern Refuse takes it to the Allied Services, LLC Landfill in Taylor County. The City of Pitts utilizes curbside pickup in order to collect solid waste. The City is responsible for the pickup one time per week and does not charge a fee for collection. Once the garbage is collected, it is taken to the old Wilcox County Landfill, where a transfer station is located. Once it reaches the transfer station, Southern Refuse takes it to the Allied Services, LLC Landfill in Taylor County. The City of Rochelle contracts with Transwaste to collect their household waste at a rate of \$12.40 per month. Transwaste utilizes curbside pickup once a week. Once the garbage is collected,

### **B. Yard Trimmings Collection**

Wilcox County and the cities of Abbeville and Rochelle provide curbside pickup for yard trimmings. Once the yard trimmings are collected, they are placed in the holding area at the old Wilcox County Landfill. The cities of Abbeville, Pineview, Pitts, and Rochelle may also utilize the holding area at the old Wilcox County Landfill where citizens may obtain mulch.

### **C. Adequacy of Collection Programs**

The collection methods utilized to collect solid waste by Wilcox County and its municipalities are adequate to serve the citizens of Wilcox County, although the County and the cities of Pineview and Pitts may wish to investigate privatization in the future as Abbeville and Rochelle currently do. With several regional landfills located in close proximity to Wilcox County, the accessibility of a landfill for solid waste collection purposes by the local governments is adequate. The collection method utilized by Wilcox County to collect recyclables is somewhat effective at best. A county-wide program to collect batteries needs to be developed as funds become available. Additional items should be considered for targeted recycling as well. The cities of Wilcox County utilize the drop off site located at the old landfill for the collection of recyclables. The cities of Pineview and Pitts do not have a program in order to collect tires and white goods. However, citizens may take their items to the drop off site located at the old landfill.

### **D. Illegal Dumping**

There is a problem in Wilcox County with illegal dumping. The County utilizes the Georgia Department of Natural Resources to combat the problem of illegal dumping. While there are few instances of illegal dumping occurring in the City of Abbeville, if it should happen, the City utilizes the city police

4. Wilcox County needs to investigate the feasibility of privatizing its solid waste collection county-wide.

#### **F. Contingency Strategy**

In case of a natural disaster or another event that may interrupt the flow of garbage pickup, Wilcox County has an agreement with Southern Refuse so that there is no interruption in solid waste pickup. The City of Abbeville has an agreement with Transwaste so that there is no interruption in solid waste pickup. The City of Pineview may utilize a private contractor, and they also have a backup truck in case of an emergency. The City of Pitts may utilize a private contractor in case of an emergency. The City of Rochelle has an agreement with Transwaste so that there is no interruption in solid waste pickup. The county and municipalities may also utilize nearby local governments to have access to solid waste collection equipment, if an excessive amount of waste is generated. If one or both of these options are necessary to adequately serve Wilcox County, the local governments would be required to go through the proper procedures to be able to put the options into operation. The time frame required would probably require at least one week to be able to go through the proper procedures to continue solid waste collection. If the collection program should become interrupted in case of a natural disaster or other event, the public will be notified on what procedures will take place via the media. This notification will take place through the newspaper and public service announcements on the radio.

### **VI. Disposal Element**

#### **A. Disposal**

The Allied Services, LLC Landfill is a private commercial municipal solid waste landfill located in Taylor County. According to GA EPD, in 2004, Allied Services, LLC Landfill had a remaining capacity of 38,524,149.0 cubic yards. Its average daily tons in 2004 was 4,400.0, and it has a rate of fill of 5,867.00 cubic yards per day. Its estimated fill date is January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2027, which means that the landfill has approximately 23 years of remaining capacity. Allied Services, LLC Landfill accepts items ranging from household wastes to hazardous waste.

## **VII. Land Limitation Element**

### **A. Natural Environmental Limitations**

Wilcox County's abundant natural resources are becoming recognized by its citizens as an increasingly important asset to the county's future growth and development. A growing interest is emerging in protecting the area's fragile resources while balancing the need for growth. The following discussion highlights the natural environmental limitations of Wilcox County.

According to the 1989 Hydrologic Atlas 18 of the Georgia Geologic Survey, Wilcox County's significant groundwater recharge areas are contained in the Southern Coastal Plain Major Land Area and the Miocene/Pliocene Recent Unconfined Aquifer and Floridan/Jacksonian Aquifer Systems and are located in the upper one-third of the county (Floridan/Jacksonian) and in small areas along the southern portion of the county's border with Ben Hill County south of Abbeville and Rochelle (Miocene/Pliocene). These areas have been identified by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources in a companion pollution susceptibility map as having medium to high pollution susceptibility, with areas of high pollution susceptibility being located in the upper one-third of the county, including the City of Pineview, with another area identified just north and west of the city limits of Abbeville along and adjacent to the Ocmulgee River. A countywide ordinance modeled after the Georgia Department of Natural Resources' Part V Environmental Planning Criteria is in effect that protects the county's groundwater recharge areas from possible contamination due to toxic or hazardous substances. A sizable portion of Wilcox County (18 percent) has also been designated as wetlands on the National Wetlands Inventory prepared by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Much of the wetlands in the county are located along the Alapaha and Ocmulgee River Basins and near major creeks, but not all of the wetlands in the county are confined to these areas. These areas of the county are known to contain a variety of habitats of protected flora and fauna, as well as nesting and breeding grounds for a number of protected animals. The County also has one river, the Ocmulgee River, which is identified for protection under the 1991 River Corridor Protection Act. The Ocmulgee River flows on the eastern end of the county, forming the county's eastern boundary with Dodge, Pulaski, and Telfair counties. A variety of hunting and fishing opportunities are located

its facility in Taylor County. Because of the County's abundant natural resources and the intent of the County's Community Vision to utilize these resources in the County's future growth and development, the County does not believe that the location of any additional solid waste handling facilities (permitted solid waste handling facilities, permitted by rule facilities, recycling processing facilities, etc.) would be compatible with the community's vision for its future growth and development.


While the cities of Abbeville and Rochelle are the only local governments in Wilcox County that have a zoning ordinance in place, the cities of Pineview and Pitts and the unincorporated area of Wilcox County do have some land use regulations in place, such as floodplain regulations. There are several factors to be taken into consideration when determining the compatibility of all solid waste handling facilities to the surrounding area. The Natural and Cultural Resources Element and other portions of the Wilcox County Joint Comprehensive Plan, as well as this Solid Waste Management Plan, identify areas where any such solid waste handling facility may or may not be acceptable. The County does not desire for any such solid waste handling facility to locate within a five (5) -mile radius of any of the municipalities. This will allow room for residential areas in and near the cities to grow and expand around the cities in those areas that are planned for future residential development. Simultaneously, it is desired that such facilities locate at a minimum of one-half mile from any residential area. This will lessen the possibility of adversely impacting adjacent properties through reduced property values or undue burdens on existing infrastructure.

Other considerations include flood plains. The County does not desire that any solid waste handling facility locate in the 100-year flood plain. In fact, DNR Rule 391-3-4-.05 (1) (d) states that a facility cannot restrict the flow of the 100-year flood. Wetlands and groundwater recharge areas are protected by the countywide ordinance based on DNR's Part V Environmental Planning Criteria. The County is also desirous of protecting the many and various natural streams that dot the area's landscape. It is desired by the County that no solid waste handling facility of any kind locate within one-half mile of any stream. All solid waste handling facilities are also discouraged from locating near any area of the county that is identified as prime farmland or as an area

Solid Waste Management Plan. Upon the completion and submittal of all required documentation, public hearings, and public meetings, the County will then conduct a review and issue its findings as to the approval or rejection, based on all applicable local, state, and federal regulations, and compatibility with local plans, and shall issue a letter certifying the project's consistency with the County's Solid Waste Management Plan.

**D. Land Limitation Needs:**

1. There is a need to develop a formal application process with rules and procedures regarding all solid waste handling facilities that are consistent with the newly updated Solid Waste Management Plan.

**Land Limitation Goals:**

1. Wilcox County seeks to create a formal application process that will insure that all solid waste handling facilities, regardless of type, are located in areas that are suitable for such facilities, are compatible with surrounding land uses, are in compliance with applicable local, state, and federal regulations, preserve the existing rural character and maintain/enhance the current quality of life while providing for compatible and quality future growth and development, prevent nuisances and uses disruptive to the community's plans and vision, will not hinder the County's ability to meet its 25% per capita waste reduction goal, and are not considered for location in areas that have been identified as unsuitable due to environmental or land use limitations.

**VIII. Education and Public Involvement Element**

**A. Existing Local Government Programs**

The local governments in Wilcox County have a couple of different programs to educate the public concerning solid waste management. Wilcox County has a limited recycling program that has been in existence since the late 1990s. The County has established certain areas within its old landfill in which recyclable items can be accepted and collected. Citizens countywide can bring certain recyclable items they may have and drop them off at the old landfill on a voluntary basis. Items that are accepted for recycling include cardboard, tires, and white goods. The County and its municipalities have a trailer at the old landfill that is used for the collection of scrap tires. Once the

The local governments in Wilcox County do not currently participate in many local or regional public involvement programs. The City of Pineview has one Garden Club, while the City of Rochelle has two such organizations. The City of Pitts has its own Beautification Committee. Wilcox County currently does not participate in any regional or state programs at this time, but there is a need to do so in the future.

**B. Solid Waste Advisory Committee/Task Force**

This is not applicable currently in any of the local governments in Wilcox County. There are no plans to establish such a committee in the near future.

**C. School System Programs**

The only currently organized education program through the Wilcox County School System is that mentioned earlier in conjunction with the City of Rochelle and Wilcox County. If a local codes enforcement program is initiated, a need exists for such a program to work closely with the local school system to provide pertinent education on recycling and other solid waste reduction activities to the county's young people.

**D. Litter Control Programs**

Wilcox County and its municipalities have previously utilized inmates from the Wilcox State Prison in Abbeville to conduct roadside pickups and other cleanup methods. The City of Pitts also utilizes the volunteer efforts of its volunteer fire department from time to time as well.

**E. Regional RDC Programs**

There currently are no RDC programs in effect in Wilcox County, nor are there any plans to establish a program(s) in the near future.

**F. Summary of Needs/Assessment**

The general priority needs as determined by the local governments for public education and involvement are as follows:

1. There is a need to establish an active codes enforcement program countywide with an emphasis on litter control, promoting the use of






